Dear Church,

Here are our current COVID protocols:

- Masking: Masking with a high-quality face mask (KN95, N95, KF94, or similar) is still required in the sanctuary and common areas of the building, and masks will be available at the door for all. Coffee hour after the 10:00 service and dinner after the 5:00 service will be completely outside.
- Eucharist: The Common Cup of communion wine will be offered for those who would like to partake of communion in both kinds. The bread will still be offered near the altar, and the Common Cup of wine will be offered on the side of the sanctuary for those who wish to drink from it. (Note: intinction—dipping the host into the chalice—will not be allowed, per the bishop's orientation.)
- Returning after having COVID-19: Those who have had COVID-19 should wait to return to church until after they have had a negative rapid test, as positive results on rapid tests (even faint positives) indicate a level of coronavirus in the body that could still be contagious to others.
- Vaccination: Though staff and volunteers must be fully vaccinated and boosted, there is currently no vaccination requirement for congregants. We encourage all congregants to ensure they are fully vaccinated and also boosted, since the coronavirus vaccines are extremely effective at reducing COVID-19 cases and at reducing poor outcomes from COVID-19.
- Symptoms: Those with any flu-like or cold-like symptoms are asked to refrain from in-person participation.
- Indoor air: Windows will be open to allow for better airflow in the sanctuary. The upgraded MERV filters and additional air purifiers will also be in use.

We will continue to monitor city-specific trends and will adjust protocols if necessary, with the intention of creating a space that is hospitable and reasonably safe for our whole church community.

Please evaluate your own risk. Though COVID-19 can cause severe illness in any of us, serious outcomes from the virus are more likely as we age and for those of us with underlying medical conditions.
