Description:

Sacred Ground is a film and readings-based dialogue series on race, grounded in faith that allows small groups to walk through chapters of America's history of race and racism, while weaving in threads of family story, economic class, and political and regional identity. The series is one of the ways The Episcopal Church is attempting to live out its commitment to racial healing, reconciliation, and justice in our personal lives, our ministries, and our society. This series is open to all, and especially designed to help white people talk with other white people. It also helps participants to peel away the

layers that have contributed to the challenges and divides of the present day – all while grounded in our call to faith, hope and love.

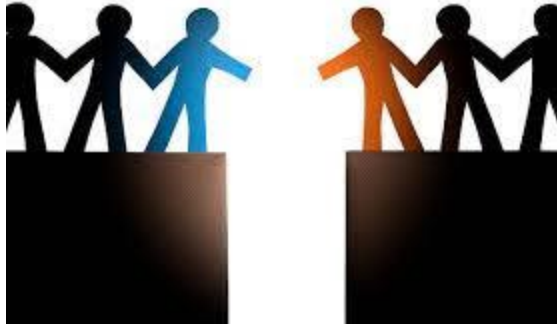

Bridging the Gap:



Description:

An initiative intended to move members of all Angels into greater partnership and allyship with communities of color, especially black communities. In addition to spending time reflecting on the idolatry of racial supremacy, the initiative will foster partnerships between All Angels and black churches for the purpose

of discovering biblical friendship across racial differences and collaborating with new friends to seek a more racially just in the world. This fall, we will be collaborating on music and study with St. Margaret's in the Bronx, NY to host a musical fundraiser and fellowship brunch. The proceeds of the event will go to restoring St Margaret's stairs at the entrance to their building.

Bridging the Gap aims to prepare All Angels members for and facilitate interracial encounters of equity so that All Angels and her soon to be identified partners can explore Christian friendship through justice seeking community engagement or activism that interrupt the ethics of domination. It will provide opportunities for members of All Angels to be in equitable relationships across racial differences for the sake of a more just world.
